1 **Though** as a LINKER (also although)



She walked out, though she hadn't paid.

(although)

2 **Even though** as a LINKER: (not although) (same as 1 above, but more emphatic)



Ernest still runs, even though he's eighty years old!

3 We also use though (not although) as an ADVERB:

He liked her. He didn't speak to her, **though**. We wanted to buy some milk. It was too late now, **though**. Everyone wanted to meet her. Not everyone liked her, **though**.
