

**Put on, down, away; put up with; put off** ★★

**1 Put + OBJECT + ADVERB**



**He put his hat on**

**He put his hat down**

**He put his hat away**

**word order**

*He put his hat on*

*He put on his hat*

*He put it on*

~~*He put on it*~~

*(many examples)*

**2 Put + up with = endure, tolerate**



**She couldn't put up with the noise**

*I find it hard to put up with the smells*

*"I don't like Michael." "You'll just have to put up with him."*

**3 Put + off**



**We'll put the meeting off until June**

*We won't cancel the concert, but we'll have to put it off for a week.*

*"Can you put Susan off? I haven't got time today."*
